

## **Jewish Population in the United States, 1989**

**T**HE JEWISH POPULATION OF the United States in 1989 was estimated to be 5,944,000, which represents hardly any change from the figure reported for 1988. (The renewal of large-scale Soviet immigration that took place in 1989 will be reflected in next year's estimate.) The current estimate is for the resident Jewish population of the country, including that both in private households and in institutional settings. Non-Jewish family members have been excluded from this total.

While the Jewish federations are the chief reporting bodies, their service areas vary in size and may represent several towns, one county, or an aggregate of several counties. In some cases we have subdivided federation areas to reflect the more natural geographic boundaries. Some estimates, from areas without federations, have been provided by local rabbis and other informed Jewish community leaders. In still other cases, the figures that have been updated are from past estimates provided by United Jewish Appeal field representatives.

The state and regional totals shown in Appendix tables 1 and 2 are derived by summing the individual estimates shown in table 3 and making three adjustments. First, communities of less than 100 are added. Second, duplicated counts within states are eliminated. Third, communities whose populations reside in two or more states (e.g., Kansas City and Washington, D.C.) are distributed accordingly.

The reader should be aware that population estimating is not an exact science and that collection procedures can result in annual fluctuations in community or state totals. In most cases where a figure differs from that shown last year, the increase or decrease did not come about in one year but occurred over a period of time and has just now been substantiated. Similarly, the results of a completed local demographic study often change the previously reported Jewish population figure. This should be understood as either an updated calculation of gradual demographic change or a correction of a faulty older estimate.

In determining Jewish population, communities count both affiliated and nonaffiliated residents. In most cases, counts are made by households, with that number multiplied by the average number of self-defined Jewish persons per household. Most communities also include those born and raised as Jews but who at present consider themselves of no religion. As stated above, non-Jews living in Jewish households, primarily the non-Jewish spouses and any non-Jewish children, are not included in the 1989 estimates presented in the appendix below.

The community reporting the largest documented numeric gain since the last estimate was completed was Dallas, Texas, whose increase—based on a 1988 demographic survey—exceeded 10,000 persons. The Norfolk-Tidewater area of Virginia also raised its estimate, following a demographic survey. Four other southern com-

munities—Atlanta, Georgia; Fort Worth, Texas; Raleigh, North Carolina; and Savannah, Georgia; and one other western community—Sacramento, California—have experienced recent growth and raised their estimates accordingly. Small but significant increases were also reported by Port Angeles and Bellingham, both in Washington State, and Ventura County and San Luis Obispo in California. The increase reported for Connecticut's Norwalk-Westport area is due to both real growth and expanded geographic parameters of that community. In Orange County, New York, the increase is due primarily to the growth of a Hassidic community near Monroe.

The Jewish population has grown in resort communities such as Palm Springs and Murietta Hot Springs, California; Port Charlotte-Punta Gorda, Florida; and the Pocono Mountain area (Pike and Wayne counties) of Pennsylvania. The latter is becoming an exurban extension of the New York City suburbs, as is Dekalb, Illinois, in relation to Chicago.

While the New York area's large numeric decline reported in last year's AJYB was due to the elimination of the non-Jews in Jewish households, this year's largest decline, that of 12,000 in Miami-Dade County, Florida, is the result of actual demographic change in recent years. The primary features of this change are an aging population, an increase in the numbers of non-Jewish immigrants settling in Jewish areas, and a preference by Jewish newcomers to Florida to locate further up the coast in Broward and Palm Beach counties.

More moderate declines have occurred in some of the older, medium- and small-sized cities in the Northeast and Midwest, part of a long-term trend in these regions. The affected communities include Evansville, Indiana; Wheeling and Huntington, West Virginia; Bayonne, New Jersey; Auburn and Cortland, New York; Mansfield, Ohio; and Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania. Declines reported for the aging resort towns of Elsinore and Sun City, California, were offset by growth in the aforementioned newer resort areas.

Finally, Hawaii's decrease is due to a correction of a previous overcount.

Cincinnati—includes Hamilton and Butler counties. Also includes Boone, Campbell, and Kenton counties in Kentucky.

Cleveland—for a total Jewish population of the Cleveland metropolitan region, please include Elyria, Lorain, and Akron totals.

Toledo—includes Fulton, Lucas, and Wood counties. Also includes Monroe and Lenawee counties, Michigan.

Youngstown—includes Mahoning and Trumbull counties. Also includes Mercer County, Pennsylvania.

#### PENNSYLVANIA

Ambridge—includes lower Beaver County and adjacent areas of Allegheny County.

Bucks County (lower portion)—includes Bensalem Township, Bristol, Langhorne, Levittown, New Hope, Newtown, Penn-del, Warrington, Yardley, Richboro, Feasterville, Middletown, Southampton, and Holland.

Philadelphia—includes Philadelphia City, Montgomery, Delaware County, Chester County, and central and upper Bucks County.
